


MARRIAGE EQUALITY OPENING NEW DOORS



Homeownership in the LGBT community has been on the rise since 2015, when the Supreme Court ruled to make same-sex marriage legal.

Among the membership of the National Association of Gay and Lesbian Real Estate Professionals surveyed:
